COMMUNICATION MATTERS

In the summer SCLU completed a consultation with care leavers to understand your experiences of having a PA, particularly in regards to Communication. Following the consultation two members of SCLU, Taina and Khalil gave a presentation to the PA's highlighting the results and offering suggestions about what could make things better for us, like answering calls within 24 hours, and using different methods to communicate such as email and WhatsApp. We asked Dave Cohen, Service Manager for the Leaving Care Service how this presentation has helped and he said,

"All PA's should let their young people know when they are on leave, and young people will be contacted if their PA is off sick and not expected back in over a week. If young people have an issue and they can't contact their PA, then there will always be a duty worker that can help them."

TOM ON WORK EXPERIENCE

Before I started my work experience I wasn't having much luck finding work...I'd been on loads of websites but they hadn't found me anything. I'd been trying to get an apprenticeship but I couldn't get one sorted. I spoke to my PA and he spoke to someone in the council who asked what

qualifications I had and stuff. I was a bit worried that without English and maths GCSEs I wouldn't get anywhere, but it didn't matter. Now I'm doing 4 weeks of work experience in 4 different areas of the council, just to see what I'd like to do for a year apprenticeship. It's been amazing meeting new, friendly people and I've got to join in with meetings and feel part of the team. I feel that already my self-confidence has got better and I can talk to more people. The best bit though has been getting an ID badge that says Sheffield City Council on it because it's really made me feel part of things!!

I would say to other people in my position to give it a go and apply...see how you like it and you never know...you could get a job for life!
